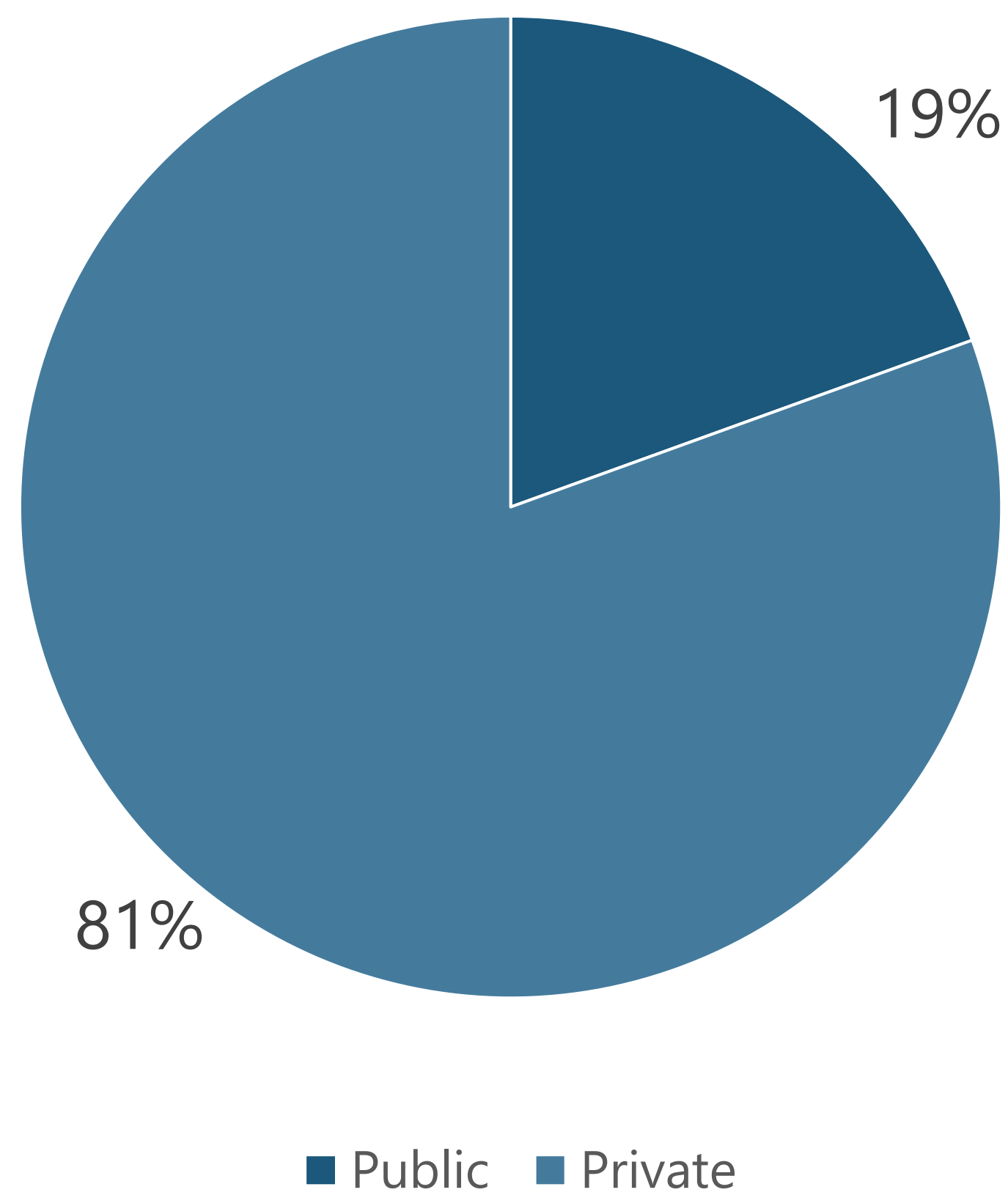


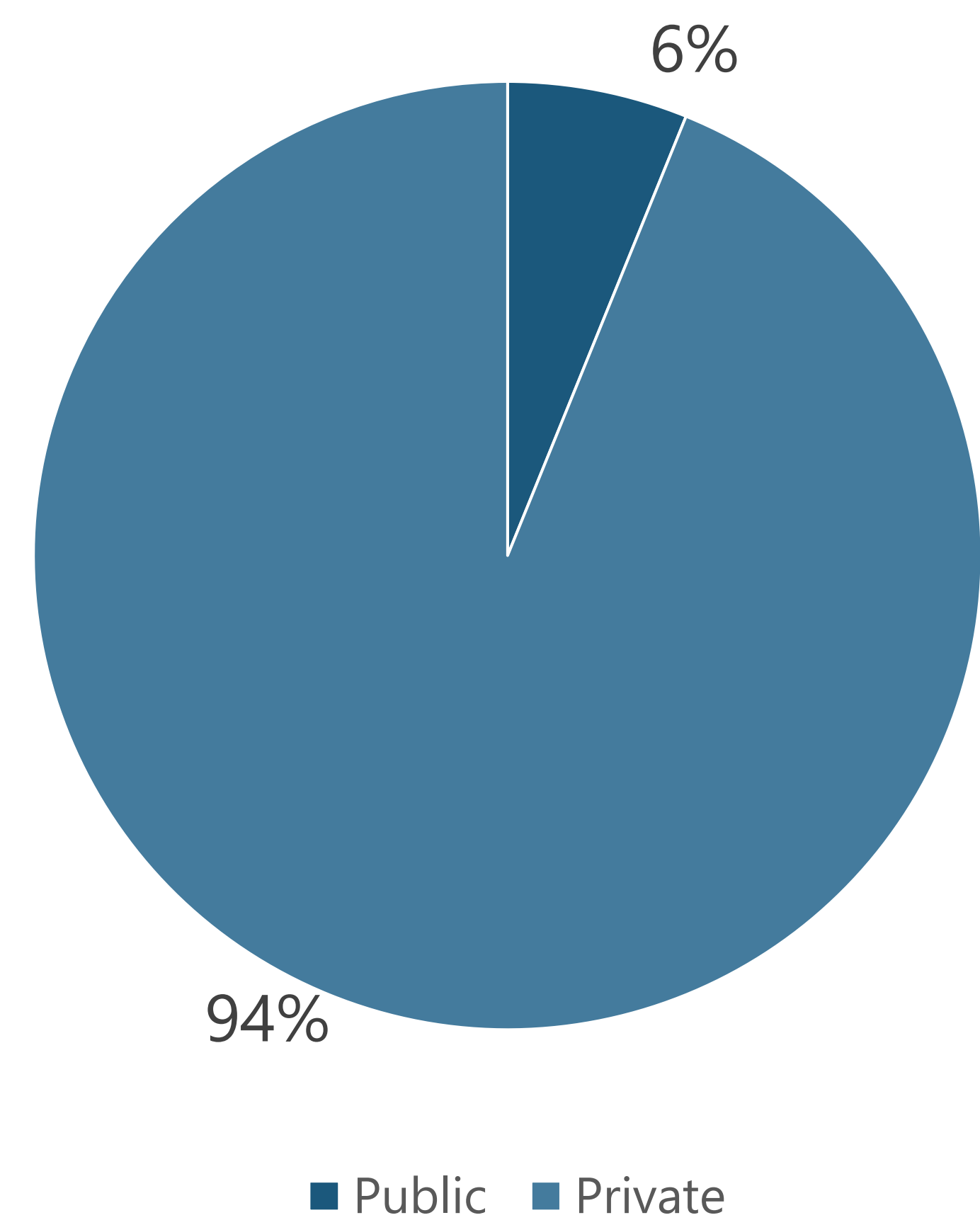
## Poland's Public and Private Application Split

## Fundings, Investments, and Policies to Drive Poland Towards Electrification

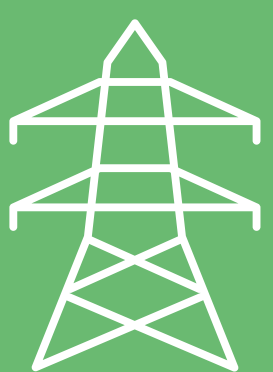
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The Polish government announced funding of 1 Billion PLN (1 USD= 4.73 PLN) for the upgradation of the electricity grid for EV charging infrastructure. The funding will be used to upgrade 4,000 km of overhead and underground power lines and for the creation of around 800 transformer-switching stations



The National Fund for Environmental Protection and Water Management announced funding of 870 million PLN for the expansion of EV charging network in both public and private applications.



The Energy Regulatory Office appointed energy retailers like Enea, Energa Obrót, and PGE Obrót as the operators of public chargers in eight cities in Poland in 2021. With this appointment, energy retailers became responsible for the management, operational safety, operation, maintenance, and repairs of publicly accessible chargers, among other things.
